Membership

The Shore Regional Organisation of Councils (**SHOROC**) is an incorporated association that provides a means by which local Councils on Sydney's Northern Beaches (**being Manly, Mosman, Pittwater and Warringah Councils**) can work together cooperatively to benefit Councils and their communities.

Each Council has its own Code of Conduct based on the Department of Local Government's revised Model Code of Conduct for Councils in NSW.

As required by the Model Code of Conduct, each Council is required to establish a Conduct Review Committee to inquire into alleged breaches of their Code by their Mayor, Councillors or General Manager. The Committees will convene on an "as required" basis.

SHOROC seeks expressions of interest from appropriately qualified, independent persons to form a panel from which **SHOROC** Councils can select a Committee or a sole reviewer as required. Applicants should have a background in a relevant area such as – law, finance, public sector management, governance, ethics, probity, conflict of interest, internal investigation etc.

While each Council is required to select persons who are independent of Council, suitably qualified persons who provide services to an individual Council are able to apply as they may be considered by the other Councils.

The term of the panel is four years and members will be paid an allowance of \$400 per meeting, including preparation. Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an interview.
